NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on Tuesday, February 19, 2008, in King County, State of Washington, at the polling places listed separately, there will be held a Presidential Primary for the purpose of nominating candidates for the office of President of the United States and Special Elections submitting to the voters for their approval or rejection the ballot measures as listed below:

To vote in the 2008 Presidential Primary and Special Election:

1. In order for your presidential primary vote to count, you may only vote for a candidate from one party.
2. On the ballot, only vote for the political party preference that matches your choice in the poll book.
3. If you do not select a party, only votes cast for ballot measures will be counted. If there are no ballot measures on your ballot, a blank ballot will be cast.

The Board of Directors of Tukwila School District No. 406 adopted Resolution No. 750, concerning a proposition to finance school programs and operation expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to maintain current funding levels and support for school programs and operation, including teaching, school supplies, technology, athletics, transportation and facility maintenance and operations, by levying the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District:

FIRE PROTECTION BONDS**

The Board of Fire Commissioners of King County Fire Protection District No. 16 adopted Resolution No. 07-21 approving a proposition to issue general obligation bonds. This proposition would authorize the District to construct and equip its headquarters fire station, undertake other capital projects throughout the District, refund all or part of its 2006 general obligation bond, issue not more than \$25,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years, and levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds. FIRE STATION CONSTRUCTION BONDS**

The Governing Board of the Valley Regional Fire Authority passed Resolution 33 concerning financing certain fire facility and equipment improvements. This proposition would authorize the Authority to acquire, construct and equip a new fire station; renovate existing facilities; purchase a new ladder truck; and make related capital improvements. To accomplish this, it would authorize the Authority to issue no more than \$19.8 million of general obligation bonds maturing within [20] years and to levy annual excess property taxes to pay and retire such bonds, all as provided in Resolution 33.
