Scope of Work

Demolish existing bridge and approaches

The following work was reviewed by the Design Review Committee on November 8, 2007 pursuant to the attached application and supporting documentation, and approved by the King County Landmarks Commission on December 18, 2007:

- *Demolish existing bridge and approaches.*

The following conditions shall apply:

- *Steel hand railing to be salvaged and re-used in the new bridge*
- *As many lighting standards as possible (minimum of one), concrete railing modules (minimum of one), steel guide track and rocker, and a major truss component are to be salvaged and placed in a new public space*
- *Control console and various gears, especially the reduction gear set are to be salvaged*
- *Interpretive displays (including photos, drawings, and historic context) are to be located on the new bridge and in a new public space adjacent to the bridge*
- *Investigation of alternative uses is required for larger sections of the bascule leaves and control rooms*
- *Photos to be submitted upon completion of the project.*

This Certificate is hereby issued pursuant to King County Code 20.62.080, but does not waive the applicant's responsibilities with respect to other permit requirements and obligations.



Note to Applicant: Work must occur exactly according to approved plans and specifications. Any revisions, omissions and/or additions to plans and specifications must be reviewed and approved by the King County Landmarks Commission.

Appeal Procedure: Any interested person may appeal the above decision to the King County Council. Written notice of the appeal may be filed within (35) calendar days of the issuance of the Certificate of Appropriateness. The written notice of appeal shall be filed with the Historic Preservation Officer and shall be accompanied by a statement setting forth the grounds for the appeal, supporting documents, and arguments.
