

# Training Announcement



## **FEMA/U.S.F.A. All-Hazards Incident Management Team**

To King County First Responders,

The City of Seattle, in cooperation with the Seattle Metro Incident Management Team, is hosting the FEMA All-Hazards Incident Management Team course in order to train personnel from King County area agencies to function as a Type 3 Incident Management Team in response to complex incidents that require coordination between multiple agencies.

The FEMA All-Hazards IMT course is open to personnel from public agencies within King County. Representation is needed from fire departments, police departments, public utilities, health, E.M.S., structural engineering, and transportation departments. Emphasis and priority will be given those who are interested in participation in regional Incident Management Teams and who have experience utilizing the Incident Command System.

The focus of the course is to enhance the skills necessary to operate as a team in various Command and General Staff positions and to promote a better understanding of team operations through application during various simulations. This course is equivalent to ICS 300 and 400 per Washington State EMD, Training Bulletin 06-002. Because the purpose of this course is to train Incident Management Team principles to personnel interested in applying to the Seattle Metro IMT, it should not be taken merely to fulfill NIMS compliance requirements.

### **Costs:**

Class is free.

No funds are currently available for overtime or backfill.

Each agency or jurisdiction will need to cover their own OT/BF costs.

Parking costs are the responsibility of the attendee.
