IT IS THE MOVER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO:	REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED:
<p>A. Check the proposed route before applying for the permit.</p> <p>B. Contact utility companies in advance of the move regarding the moving of wires, poles or other obstructions.</p> <p>C. Notify the Public Works Traffic Section (296-8153) of the time of the proposed move</p> <p>D. Notify the Fire Marshall (296-6675) of the time of the proposed move.</p> <p>E. Obtain permission from local or state authorities when the move will pass through an incorporated area or use a state highway.</p> <p>F. Properly repair or replace road signs damaged or removed as a result of the move. ESCORT VEHICLES

- * Escort vehicles front and rear required on two-lane roads for vehicles or loads over 11 feet wide. On multiple-lane roads rear escort vehicles required for vehicles or loads over 14 feet wide; front and rear escort vehicles required for vehicles or loads over 20 feet wide.
- * Escort vehicles shall be passenger cars or two-axle trucks, licensed, in safe operating condition, and designed to afford driver clear, unobstructed vision front and rear.
- * Escort vehicles should travel 800-1500 feet from the load or at such distance as will insure maximum safety of traveling public.
- * Escort car operators shall be experienced in operation of escort cars. Only people assisting with vehicle and load may ride in escort car.

SIGNS

- * Oversize load signs (at least 5 feet wide X 10 inches high with 1 inch black stroke on yellow background) must be mounted on front of towing vehicle on rear of load or trailing unit and above roofline of escort cars. Signs must be mounted at least 5 feet above roadway or as high as practicable.

FLAGGERS

- * Flaggers shall be at least 18 years of age and shall be equipped with a red flag not less than 12 inches square.
- * The flagger shall dismount from the vehicle to direct traffic. The flagger shall direct traffic at all locations where traffic may be obstructed, where it is necessary to infringe on the opposite bound lane of traffic due to breakdown, pulling off the road or other causes or where the movement may
